Entry Point Central provided an emergency training for Albcontrol

Entry Point Central (EPC), the joint international ATS Academy of HungaroControl and Entry Point North, provided an emergency training for 75 Albanian air traffic controllers (ATCOs) in Budapest. This third-party training has been the most significant since EPC was founded.

Entry Point Central (EPC) has completed the annual emergency training for the air traffic controllers of Albcontrol, the air navigation service provider (ANSP) of Albania. The tender had been won by Entry Point North Group. The 75 tower, approach and enroute ATCOs were trained in Budapest between March and June at EPC, the joint international ATS Academy of HungaroControl and Entry Point North. This third-party training has been the most significant since EPC's foundation. The participants were satisfied with the training and the friendly environment at HungaroControl's Academy. They also confirmed that both the theoretical and practical content of the training were useful and beneficial for their future work.

In addition to improving its traditional air navigation services and technical and technological background, one of HungaroControl's strategic steps is the establishment of a regional, Central European air navigation knowledge centre in joint effort with its partners.

The purpose of HungaroControl's capital investment projects is to enable the Central European Functional Airspace Block (FAB CE), a regional co-operation of seven Central European countries, to provide competitive services and operate at the highest technical and technological standard.
